## <u>Capital</u>

Cal Anderson Memorial- 2025 Request: \$412,000 - Partial funding

Final 2025 budget included:

• \$390,000 (SSB 5195 - Sec. 1071)

## <u>Operating</u>

## 5599 Grant Funding- 2025 Request: \$2M MOE— Partial funding

2023 Operating Budget included \$2M (GF-S) to establish a community grant program administered through the Department of Commerce. Pursuant to SB 5599 (2023) this flexible funding was available to organizations that support/assist youth and their families needing assistance to access protected health care services.

Final 2025 budget included:

• \$500 K in FY 2026 and \$500 K in FY 2027 for the Office of Homeless Youth for Prevention and Protection Programs to provide supportive care grants to organizations to address the needs of youth seeking protected health care services (ESSB 5167 - Sec. 130 subsection 29)

#### Center for Children and Youth Justice (CCYJ)- 2025 Request: \$750,000 - Not funded

CCYJ provided training to DCYF staff on how to support the needs of LGBTQ+ youth who are accessing or receiving state funded programs. The training program was developed and provided by CCYJ staff and paid for by the organization through private fundraising. DCYF initially provided funding for travel and expenses. CCYJ has also provided similar services to AOC and would like to expand to provide training for other state agencies that interact with and provide services to this vulnerable youth population. CCYJ is no longer able to cover the expense of providing the state agencies with this important service.

#### LGBTQ Legal Aid- 2025 Request: \$700,000-Partial funding

2023 Operating Budget provided one-time funding (\$700,000) to a non-profit organization to provide legal aid to underserved individuals with a focus on Black gender-diverse communities. (Lavender Rights/Utopia)

Final 2025 budget included:

 \$150 K in FY 2026 and \$150 K in FY 2027 for a grant to a nonprofit organization to provide legal aid in subjects including, but not limited to, criminal law and civil rights cases for underserved populations focusing on Black gender-diverse communities. The grant recipient must be a nonprofit organization with offices in Seattle and Tacoma and with a mission to provide intersectional legal and social services for Black intersex and genderdiverse communities in Washington. (SSB 5167 - Sec. 129, subsection 22)

#### Entre Hermanos- 2025 Request: \$250,000 — Fully funded

Funding would allow Entre Hermanos to expand and provide services in Snohomish County. (Funded through Dept. of Commerce - Community Services Division - see Agency Details document Item #37, pg 49)
