


Perceived safety

the state of Washington?







Which hate crimes you have experienced while living in Washington?







Did your LGBTQ+ identity negatively affect your treatment by other inmates or personnel while incarcerated?








Perceived safety x age



Perceived safety x race/ethnicity





Perceived safety x gender






Perceived safety x region



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






Community connectedness x race/ethnicity




Community connectedness x gender






Community connectedness x disability
